Unique Features



- Paul did not plant the church in Rome and had never visited the church when he wrote his letter
- Romans is the longest of Paul's letters and most theologically profound
- Logical arrangement of material; debate format; anticipated his opponents objections

Unique Features



- Paul quoted from the OT more than in all his 12 other letters combined
- Extensive treatment of themes: sin, justification by faith, life in the Spirit, God's relationship with Israel
- Paul greets close to 30 people at the close of his letter

- All men are guilty of sin & without excuse (1:1-3:20)
- Salvation is received thru faith (3:21-31)
- Abraham was saved by faith (4)
- The blessings of faith (5)
- A warning against licentiousness (6)
- A warning against legalism (7)
