Illustrative



They paint a picture for us:

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. (Psalm 23:1)

Illustrative



As a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for you, O God. (Psalm 42:1)

Emotionally Honest



They give us permission to express our feelings:

How long, O LORD? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? (Psalm 13:1)

Emotionally Honest



I am weary with my moaning; every night I flood my bed with tears; I drench my couch with my weeping. (Psalm 6:6)

Prophetic



They point us toward Jesus:

16 For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet—17 I can count all my bones—they stare and gloat over me; 18 they divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots. (Psalm 22:16-18)

Prophetic



Then He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." (Luke 24:44)

Offer Hope



They offer us hope for the future:

- <u>1</u> Hear my cry, O God, listen to my prayer;
- 2 from the end of the earth I call to you when my heart is faint. Lead me to the rock that is higher than I, 3 for you have been my refuge, a strong tower against the enemy. (Psalm 61:1-3)

True to Life



They speak to our spiritual journey:

"In Psalms, we find poems of **orientation**, poems of **disorientation**, and poems of **reorientation**. These correspond to the realities of human life . . . Human life consists in satisfied seasons of well-being that evoke gratitude for the constancy of blessing . . . Human life also consists in anguished seasons of hurt, alienation, suffering, and death . . ."
