

Week 4 (and final) - March 6th - Small Group Curriculum

Tonight, you are the panel. We are going to break you into groups then we are going to read off some questions and assign various questions to each group. We will then give you 20 minutes with your group to use your bibles and approved other resources to answer the questions you've been assigned. (Leaders could let students look up gotquestions.org or biblegateway.com or sonic light to find complimentary articles. -Monitor their web usage in group/ with you.)

At __ time we will regather, and each panel will have X minutes to answer their questions as we ask them. Each person needs to already know which question they're answering and what they're answer is because you only get X minutes total AND we as leaders will add in 2 surprise questions for your panel to answer.

Suggestions break students into at least 3 groups and if so give each group 4 questions to answer initially then pepper in a unassigned questions to groups that go fast through their time or a doing well at answering.

The point of this is peers are going to ask them why they care about boundaries or why they won't date or why they find these certain qualities attractive. They need to know why for themselves. Also, peers might ask their advice, they may get to answer these questions for their friends more than you do.

With leftover time you can let kids ask you questions. Be biblical and extra thoughtful in response. (You may not have time for you to play panel and that's ok.) Resist letting kids ask, answering, or creating What is ____ questions. If kids ask, "what is ____? "always point them towards parents. We don't want to define, that's the parents job. We are secondary disciplers.
