Mark	Mark	57-59	Servant (10:45)	• Suffering Servant Serves (1-10) • Suffering Servant Sacrifices (11-16)	Jesus came to serve and give His life as a ransom
Luke	Luke	58-60	Son of Man (19:10)	• Son of Man Seeks the Lost (1-18) • Son of Man Saves the Lost (19-24)	Jesus came to seek and save the lost

Theme—Salvation
(Romans 1:16-17)

Gospel—One Verse
Evangelism (Romans 6:23)

5 Big Theological Words

- **Justification:** Being declared righteous by faith in Christ on the basis of JC's work on the cross (5:1, 9); delivers us from the penalty of sin.
- **Propitiation** (toward God): Satisfying and turning away God's righteous wrath because of JC's work on the cross (3:25, 5:9).
- **Redemption** (toward sin): Being purchased out of the slave market of sin (3:24, 6:22).
- **Reconciliation** (toward man): Restoration of peace between God and man through JC's work on the cross (5:1, 10-11).
- **Sanctification:** Being conformed to the image of Christ in our daily lives (6:19, 22); requires obedience; delivers us from the power of sin.
