You are preparedyou have it in the moment (Ephesians 4:29 and Prov 19:11 are personal examples)	

John Piper on the value of scripture memorization

- Makes meditation possible at times when you can't be reading the Bible
- Strengthens my faith. I hear the Word in my head.
- Conforms my mind to God's viewpoint
- Makes the Word more accessible in overcoming temptatio
- Guards my mind, making it easier for me to detect error
- Enables me to hit the Devil in the face with a force he cannot resis
- Provides the strongest and sweetest words for ministering to others in need
- Provides the matrix for fellowship with Jesus because he talks to me in the Word and no where else
