





"Husbands, love your wives, and do not be harsh with them... Fathers, do not provoke your children, lest they become discouraged."



- Father involvement in school is associated with the higher likelihood of a student getting mostly A's.
- Fatherless children are twice as likely to drop out of school.
- Youths in father-absent homes have significantly higher odds of delinquencies & incarceration.
- Teens without fathers are twice as likely to be involved in early sexual activity and seven times more likely to get pregnant as an adolescent.



- 26-year study: the most important childhood factor in developing empathy is a dad's involvement in the family.
- Mom attends church regularly, dad doesn't: 2% of the time children will attend regularly.
- Dad attends regularly, mom doesn't: 44% of the time children will attend regularly.



- When a child is the first to connect to a church, about 3.5% of the families will follow that child to church.
- When a wife/mom is the first to connect to a church, about 17% of the families will follow mom to that church.
- When a husband/dad connects to a church, 94% of the families will follow!




Spiritual Leadership is...

- RESULT: Children are rejecting our hypocrisy, not our theology.






