





Joshua: Success

Christ in Joshua: Joshua is a type of Christ (Heb 2:10; 2 Cor 2:1; Rom 8:37)

- Moses (Law) couldn't take the Israelites into the Promise Land. Only Joshua ("Jesus") could lead them into the Promise

<u>Author</u>: Anonymous but perhaps Samuel?

<u>Purpose</u>: Demonstrates Israel's corruption from within (seven sin cycles) and oppression from without (foreign nations)

Judges: Failure

- Did not drive out the inhabitants" (1:19-33; 3:5-6);
- "And the people of Israel again did what was evil in the sight
- of the Lord" (2:11; 3:7, 12; 4:1; 6:1; 10:6; 13:1);
 "Everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (17:6; 18:1; 21:25);
- "In those days there was no king in Israel" (17:6; 18:1; 19:1; 21:25)
