Do You Want to be Healed?

hen the chapter opens, Jesus is in Jerusalem celebrating a feast of the Jews.
He encountered a man who could not walk and healed him on the
Sabbath. Because it was a day of rest, the miracle angered the Jewish leaders.

Jesus responded by explaining exactly who He is in relation to God the Father. Jesus
is Judge, the giver of life, and equal in all ways to the Father. Though they might not see
it yet, He Himself is God.

Pause for a moment and reflect: What is hard right now? In what ways are you seeking life outside of your relationship with God? In what ways is God satisfying you in this season? What are you praying for? Where have you seen God answer prayer? Write your reflections below.

SHEEP GATE

Sheep Gate was an opening in the northern city wall. 23

BETHESDA

There was a widely held belief at this time that whoever first entered the pools of Bethesda after the waters were disturbed would experience healing.²⁴

SABBATH

Sabbath was a day of rest ordained by God (Exodus 20:8-11). However, the Jews added to God's instruction, making new requirements which God never asked. During this time, even picking up a mat (John 5:10) would be considered by the Pharisees to be breaking God's law.

HEALING

For other stories in the Gospels where Jesus heals on the Sabbath, read Matthew 12:1-14, Mark 2:23-3:6, and Luke 13:10-17.

JESUS IS GOD

"Nowhere else in the Gospels do we find our Lord making such a formal, systematic, orderly, regular statement of his own unity with the Father, his divine commission and authority, and the proofs of his Messiahship, as we find in this discourse." ²⁶

- 5. The healing of the paralyzed man is the third sign, or miracle, in John. In the space below, list what this sign reveals about Jesus. (For help, jump ahead to verse 18.)
- 6. Immediately after being healed, the man runs into opposition from the Jews. The Jews were upset partially because they believed Jesus was breaking the Sabbath. Read Matthew 22:36-40. What were the Pharisees missing? What was the heart behind the law?

Now, explain the relationship between faith and good works.

TRINITY

God exists as one God in three Persons. Three words to rightly understand this relationship are unity, equality, and distinction. God is one (unity). The Father, Son, and Spirit are each God (equality). And the Father, Son, and Spirit are each a distinct person with a distinct role (distinction).

JUDGE

For more verses on Jesus as Judge, read: Acts 10:42, 17:31; 2 Corinthians 5:10; 2 Timothy 4:1, 8.

OLD TESTAMENT

All the Old Testament points toward Jesus. Though Moses was faithful, neither he, nor the law God gave him, was intended to save the hearts of the people.

LOVE OF GOD

"Had there been any love for God in their hearts, it would have manifested itself by their acceptance of the one who came to them in the name of God." ²⁷

VERSE 34

Don't ever forget the purpose behind Jesus' testimony. Verse 34 makes it clear: "... so that you may be saved." His teaching is not just for knowledge gain, but for heart change.

RELIGIOUS PRACTICES

"The Jews had worked out their pattern of religion and tried to fit God into it. They did not seek first the way of God and then try to model their religious practices on it." See Matthew 23:27-28 for Jesus' comments on this. ²⁸
